The History of the Fredericksburg Seniors

(This history will be an ongoing story of this organization and will be provided as space allows.)

As Reverend Self mentioned at our September Luncheon, the history of this organization goes back many years. In fact, the forerunner to the Fredericksburg Seniors Organization was "The Golden Age Club," which started in 1954. However, due to a lack of interest, it ended its run.

In 1968, Mary Ball Women's Club, along with several downtown churches, initiated a drive to reopen a Senior Citizens Center.

St. George's Episcopal Church donated a small parish building on Princess Anne Street. Then the renovations began! Paneling was donated and installed, carpeting was laid due to the generosity of a local merchant. Light fixtures were donated by Piedmont Electric. Montgomery Ward's contribution was the kitchen utensils, and F.W. Woolworth allowed the Mary Ball members to select art work.

One of the goals was to have a club with a relaxed atmosphere. At the time there were 25-30 members with the Mary Ball members serving as hostesses. The activities included card playing, reading, crafts, and a small kitchen where members could fix snacks.

At pot of coffee was always brewing and doughnuts were donated and brought in by Mr. Hudson and shared by everyone.

The center had an official "Grand Opening" on April 20, 1970, and was dedicated by Mayor Josiah P. Rowe. Four hundred people attended the Open House. It was a complete community effort with support from many people who helped them reach their goal. It provided
